Diane is a professional with a master's degree in Rehabilitation Counseling from Syracuse University and a graduate certificate focused in Leadership from Cornell University NYSSILR.

Diane is a Certified Rehabilitation Counselor (CRC), a Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC), and a Certified Employment Support Professional (CESP). Diane also serves an experienced adjunct instructor with Keuka College and as a consultant trainer for Innovations.

Diane resides in Corning with her husband and has two adult children. Diane has been involved in the community participating on several non-profit boards, as the chair of student volunteers for the Corning LPGA and for the past ten years as a volunteer and facilitator with Corning's Gaffer District events.
